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Students even interview Minister of Education on school radio station



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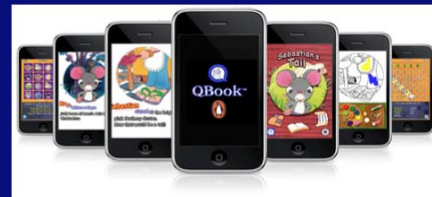
Invercargill, New Zealand: world's first city with an interactive digital whiteboard in every classroom.
